NEW LEGISLATIVE PROVISIONS

Effective February 21, 2003

Restraint Systems: Section 4581 A(1), (1.1), (2)

(1) All drivers are responsible to secure children from birth to age four in an approved child passenger restraint system. The fine is waived if driver shows proof of a car seat. (primary law)

(1.1) All drivers are responsible to secure children four years of age or older but under eight years of age in a seat belt system and an approved child booster seat. The fine is waived if driver shows proof of a car seat. (secondary law)

(2) All drivers are responsible to secure all children eight years of age or older but under eighteen years of age anywhere in the vehicle in a seat belt system. (secondary law)

Offense: Failure to comply with the provisions in (1) or (1.1) shall be guilty of a summary offense with a maximum fine of \$100. Failure to comply with provisions in (2) shall be guilty of a summary offense with a fine of \$10.
