**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

**TREASURER'S REPORT**

A. Mr. Cracas read the Treasurer's Report for April 2006. The Report is on file and available for review at the Township Office. Mrs. Glaum made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Mr. Cracas seconded the motion. With no further discussion the motion was carried with all voting Aye.

**BILLS FOR APPROVAL**

**RESOLUTION 2006-05-11**

A. Mr. Cracas made a motion to approve Resolution 2005-05-11, Designation of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), as the basis for all incident management in the Township of West Pikeland. Mrs. Glaum seconded the motion. With no further discussion the motion was carried with all voting Aye.

**AWARDED GRANT FROM PA. COUNCIL OF THE ARTS**

A. Mr. Hallman III read the letter dated May 26, 2006 from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts notifying the Township that a grant in the amount of \$2,000.00 has been awarded to the Township. The Township had made application for this Technical Assistance and Professional Development Program Grant.

**PERSONS WISHING TO BE HEARD**

A. John Matthews of Art School Road submitted a letter dated October 2005, Revised May 2006 regarding alternative solutions and alternative sites for the proposed Salt Shed at the Cultural Center. A lengthy discussion ensued regarding alternative sites for the proposed salt shed. Mr. Cracas stated that the submitted letter did not contain a rational alternative site. Mr. Matthews asked that the Board supply the group with information pertaining to a feasibility study of building a salt storage shed and additional road maintenance buildings in association to the costs involved.
