West Pikeland Township EAC Meeting- January 2, 2020

Call to order 9:01 AM

- 1. Minutes approved
- 2. Survey results, as organized by Brian
 - a. Top 5, in order: Water issues (stream quality, surface water, etc.); Waste reduction (including plastics); Invasive species; Lawn chemicals; Climate plan
 - b. It was noted that many of these issues are inextricably related
 - c. The committee will concentrate on top 3 issues in the near future
 - d. **Brian will email the committee a readable "snapshot" of the survey** for easy reading on the EAC web page
 - e. Many thanks to both Brian and Glenn for their valuable work!
- 3. Township Energy Audit
 - a. Donna sent data request to Jonathan Slaven for the purpose of creating a baseline for township CO2 usage; JS has supplied some data and **Donna will connect with him again for more info**
 - b. After baseline measurements are calculated, EAC will bring this data to township BOS, pointing out where we are now as a township and opportunities for improvement
 - c. John notes that many surrounding townships have already completed this kind of audit, which is one of the steps necessary for WPT to join the Ready for 100 movement
- 4. Topics for future special meetings/presentations
 - a. It was noted that these meetings should ideally reflect the interests of township residents, as reflected in the survey and feedback from residents going forward
 - b. <u>Proposed first topic</u> for a possible meeting on the eve of March 11: Water Issues, using the topic of eels and their recent introduction into the Pickering Creek watershed as a focus for a broader conversation. Glenn will contact Vic Laubach from Green Valleys about appearing as a speaker. Linda will contact J. Slaven to make sure of March 11 is available in the township meeting room
 - c. <u>Proposed second topic</u>: Info session on Ready for 100 (ideally presented after township baseline energy usage is determined)
 - d. It was recommended that publicity for these events include: a limited number of strategically-placed lawn signs, flyers, and FB and website postings
- 5. EAC web page update
 - a. Donna sent additional content to J Slaven for the EAC site, including eel article, minutes from past meetings, ROE info
 - b. It was recommended that a small group meet with Jonathan for advice about promoting the EAC and its agenda through the website and social media
- 6. New business
 - a. John noted that the Holiday Stroll was a great success; committee agreed that EAC should have a presence at this event next year
 - b. Brian Maher was officially voted as an alternate member of the WPT EAC
 - c. It was noted that EAC committee members will have staggered terms over the next 3 years
