Police Department Monthly Report Period from January 01 to January 31, 2026.

Executive Summary

During the month of January, the West Pikeland Township Police Department responded to a consistent level of calls for service in line with historical seasonal trends. Patrol operations remained stable throughout the reporting period. A winter storm occurred on January 25, 2026, causing hazardous road conditions and subsequent school closings, but no criminal incidents occurred that posed a significant threat to public safety. Officers continued to focus on proactive patrol, traffic safety, and responsive service to township residents.

The cost of the vehicle is discounted through a COSTARS police vehicle discount program. There will be additional costs for decommissioning two patrol vehicles, and installation of equipment and graphics on the new patrol vehicles. The decommissioned vehicles will be sold and revenues returned to the township.

Overtime usage remained within approved budgetary limits and was primarily associated with patrol coverage and court appearances.
