



# West Pikeland Township

## Police Department Monthly Report

Period from February 1, 2026 to February 28, 2026

### Executive Summary

During the month of February, the West Pikeland Township Police Department responded to a consistent level of calls for service in line with historical seasonal trends. Patrol operations remained stable throughout the reporting period. A winter storm occurred on February 16, 2026, causing hazardous road conditions and subsequent school closings, but no criminal incidents occurred that posed a significant threat to public safety. Chief Goggin attended a virtual meeting with the Chester County EOC prior to the storm occurrence. Officers continued to focus on proactive patrol, traffic safety, and responsive service to township residents.
